With the absence of both Commissioner Metzler and Wippel, the Pickaway County Board of Commissioners did not meet in Regular Session and no formal action was taken on this day, Monday, July 27, 2009, however; Commissioner Reeser was available. **In the Matter of
Payment of Bills:**

On July 20, 2009, due to today's anticipated absences of Commissioner Metzler and Commissioner Wippel, the Commissioners authorized Ryan Scribner, along with Commissioner Reeser, to sign and approve *Then & Now Certifications* related to the weekly submittal of vouchers and approval of the payment of bills submitted by county departments and agencies.

Commissioner Reeser and Mr. Scribner reviewed the listing of invoices and signed all associated documentation approving payment of bills totaling, **\$115,463.42**. The vouchers approved for payment are listed in the Commissioners' 2009 Voucher Journal, pages dated July 24, 2009.

**In the Matter Application for
East-West Connector Project:**

Nate Green, P3 Economic Development Director, along with Anthony Neff and Chris Mullins, Deputy County Engineers, met with Commissioner Reeser regarding plans to submit an application to the Ohio Department of Transportation's *Transportation Review Advisory Council* (TRAC) for the Pickaway East-West Connector, which will require a local match. The East-West Connector is a proposed four-lane roadway stretching roughly three to four miles from the southern end of Rickenbacker Airport in the vicinity of the Norfolk Southern Rickenbacker Intermodal Terminal to U.S. Rt. 23.

**In the Matter of
Weekly Dog Warden Report:**

The weekly report for the Pickaway County Dog Shelter was filed for week ending July 25, 2009.

A total of \$533 was reported being collected as follows: \$192 in sales of dogs; \$35 in redemptions; and \$85 in donations; \$195 in sales of tags; and \$26 in late tag fee penalties.

Five (5) dogs were euthanized.

No firearms were discharged.
