Designation of Financial Institutions for the
Deposit of Pickaway County's Active and Interim Funds:

Ellery Elick, Pickaway County Treasurer, met with the Commissioners following his review of solicited proposals submitted by various eligible financial institutions for the deposit of active and interim funds for Pickaway County. Per Ohio Revised Code §135.33, every four years the County Board of Commissioners, upon the recommendation of the County Treasurer, shall designate one or more eligible institutions within the territorial limits of the county as public depositories for active monies for the next four-year period. The County Treasurer provided an estimate of \$20 million as the estimate of the aggregate amount of public monies that might be available for deposit of public monies at any one time. Of the nine financial institutions solicited, five proposals were received which included the Fifth Third Bank of Circleville; Savings Bank of Circleville; Kingston Bank; US Bank of Circleville; and J. P. Morgan Chase Bank of Circleville.

Following Mr. Elick's summary of the proposals and addressing several questions from the Commissioners; it was his recommendation that the Savings Bank of Circleville be designated as the main depository for the active funds and the custodian of the county's investment assets.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE Board of County Commissioners of Pickaway County, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The Board of County Commissioners is authorized to designate, upon recommendation of the County Treasurer, one or more eligible institutions as public depositories for active monies.

Regarding Sheriff Department Roof Re-cover Project:

Sheriff Radcliff and Jack Middaugh, Administrative Assistant, met with the Commissioners regarding the project estimate and bid results for the Pickaway County Sheriff Department/Jail Roof Recover Project. Mike Smith of WKKJ/Clear Channel Radio, Chillicothe, Ohio, was also in attendance.

The project's bid opening was conducted on August 31, 2009, and the lowest proposal (\$161,500.09) out of the five received was much higher than the project's estimate (\$90,000). In researching the matter, it

was discovered that the estimate was calculated using a 12,000 sq. ft. figure when the roof area to be recovered is actually 20,000 sq. ft.

Mr. Middaugh provided drawings for the Commissioners' review reflecting the entire roof area broken down into sections that will ultimately need recovered. Section A, which encompasses the roof over the kitchen and gymnasium has leakage problems and is in the most need of being addressed with a cost estimate of \$70,700. It was also determined that a "saddle" at the low area in the roof should also be installed estimated to be \$2,500 - \$5,000. There could be additional charges to repair the roof fan that should be done at the same time as the roof recover for Section A. The roof areas over the jail pods are not in immediate need of addressing. With the county's 2009 capital plan allowing \$90,000 for the project, it was determined that the section in most need of repair will be done this year. Roof re-cover for the jail pods will be done on an as-needed basis. In addition, the department's five-year capital plan will require adjustment as the roof re-cover project will now be done in phases due to the unplanned project cost increase that will be paid from the capital expenditures fund.

The question was raised as to whether the project should be re-bid since the scope of work from the original project has changed. Following further discussion, Mr. Reeser offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Wippel to approve Section A, that will include the placement of a saddle in the low area of the roof, and the County Prosecutor will be consulted in reference to a re-bid.

Local Technology Needs:

Nate Green, P3 Economic Development Director, met with the Commissioners regarding Pickaway Connect, a public/private collaborative charged to identify opportunities to pool resources and buying power to meet telecommunication technology (IT) needs and challenges in a more efficient manner. Robert Adkins, of the Pickaway County IT Department, Terry Frazier, and Mike Smith of WKKJ/Clear Channel Radio, Chillicothe, Ohio were also in attendance.

The partners of Pickaway Connect include representatives from Pickaway County; City of Circleville; Berger Health System; Ohio Christian University (OCU); Circleville City Schools; Pickaway Progress Partnership (P3); and the Pickaway County Chamber of Commerce. It is the vision of Pickaway Connect to develop the infrastructure and resources necessary to compete in the 21st century technology driven economy and ultimately serve as economic development tool by leveling the technology playing field. Most of the members of Pickaway Connect currently have fiber rings, provided by Time Warner, resulting in

a few interconnectivity gaps that could be filled with a wireless solution. Mr. Green explained that the combined partners in Pickaway Connect spend more than \$2,500,000 a year on technology including voice and data services and support. In spite of this significant outlay of resources each entity has ongoing unmet needs including, but not limited to: lack of connectivity/redundancy, limited access to offsite data storage, lack of or limited disaster recovery; lack of interconnectivity of emergency services; heightened security for all systems; limited access to quality IT support; and insufficient resources to upgrade antiquated equipment. The Pickaway Connect member's representatives believe that the odds of meeting their respective unmet technology needs, including reduced costs, are much greater if addressed collectively rather than individually and decided that each will go to their respective decision makers to propose the concept. Mr. Scribner pointed out that OCU has submitted applications for federal grants dedicated to these types of projects and if any of these applications were to be approved it would be advantageous to have specific projects identified and a structured master plan in place.

In further discussing the matter, it was noted that a good first step in moving forward in a collaboratively manner would be to address filling in the gaps on Time Warner's map of served areas. P3 could work on behalf of the Pickaway Connect partnership. The Commissioners agreed, stating that the concept is definitely worth pursuing and asked that the appropriate steps be initiated.

- **JEDD Income Tax Update:**

When the Commissioners inquired if the City of Columbus has implemented the collection of income tax within the Joint Economic Development District (JEDD) yet, Mr. Green informed them that it has not. Partners in the JEDD include Pickaway County, Harrison Township, and the City of Columbus. It was decided that Mr. Green will draft a letter to the City of Columbus Auditor and provide it for the Commissioners' review prior to signatures.

- **Madison Township JEDD**

The Madison Township JEDD agreement still needs to be signed by all partners. The question was also raised regarding Madison Township also being included in the Cooperative Economic Development Area (CEDA). A brief conversation was also held as in reference to the uncertainty related to the Village of Ashville view on how the collection of income tax from people living within and/or working within the CEDA is to be distributed.

Discuss Amendment to the County's E9-1-1 Plan:

Terry Frazier, Pickaway County E9-1-1 Coordinator, met with the Commissioners concerning reconvening the Pickaway County E9-1-1 Planning Committee for the purpose of a possible amendment to the Pickaway County E9-1-1 plan. The E9-1-1 Planning Committee comprised of the President of the Pickaway County Board of Commissioners, the City of Circleville Mayor; and a member of the Scioto Township Trustees, the county's most populous township.

Mr. Frazier informed the Commissioners that he was recently invited to and attended a meeting with the newly formed Pickaway County Fire Chief's Association that replaced the Pickaway County's Fire Fighters Association, where he provided a requested presentation regarding his role as the county's E9-1-1 coordinator. With the current E9-1-1 plan, the City of Circleville handles dispatching emergency calls within the city limits and the Pickaway County Sheriff Department handles the remaining calls. Mr. Frazier said the current plan was written so the county sheriff and city police chief essentially have autonomy as far as policies, procedures, practices, equipment, maintenance, employee hiring and training, and it has worked fairly well. He informed the Commissioners that a number of concerns were raised during the meeting by the fire fighter and emergency medical community regarding some needs they have now in addition to emerging opportunities for E9-1-1 to dispatch the various public safety forces. Recently, an attempt was made to hold a meeting between the President of the Pickaway County Fire Chief's Association, Chip Welsh, and the Pickaway County Sheriff, and Mr. Frazier, however; when the meeting was unable to coordinate with the sheriff's calendar, Mr. Frazier and Mr. Welsh met where concerns were expressed by

Mr. Welsh regarding the timeliness in receiving emergency call information from the sheriff's department, such as time history, etc., so all proper reports may be completed. Mr. Frazier stated that fire departments would like to come up with a mechanism to dispatch specific equipment to a call depending on the nature of the call and geographic location to initially send out the appropriate equipment to "get the ball rolling" instead of waiting on the fire chief to place directive radio calls. This now raises the question of whether it is an E9-1-1 plan issue or simply a relationship between the sheriff department and the fire departments. Mr. Frazier stated that if it is the former, he has a request; if it is the latter, he will instruct the fire chief's association to continue to work with the sheriff. Mr. Frazier stated that he and Chief Welsh believe there is a mechanism that the E9-1-1 Planning Committee might explore which will require the county's E9-1-1 Technical Advisory Committee to convene to consider possible adjustments to the current plan. Per the Ohio Revised Code, in order for the committee to meet to discuss and make any necessary adjustments to the plan would require the authority of the Pickaway County Board of Commissioners.

Mr. Frazier stated that the county's current 9-1-1 plan was adopted in 1991, and has not really been looked at, amended, or discussed until about two years ago when the county went with the wireless enhanced E91-1 for which there was mechanism in Ohio law that did not call for the Technical Advisory Committee to convene because the amendment was a federal communications requirement. The Technical Advisory Committee is comprised of at least one fire chief, one police chief; the county sheriff; a representative of the highway patrol, one representative of each telephone company in the county; and the EMA director. Whether an addendum is made to the plan remains to be seen. Mr. Frazier stated that if the Planning Committee wants to decide whether to amend the plan to include a certain policy on what constitutes an emergency, how 9-1-1 call are taken and dispatched, what records are maintained, training protocols, etc., it will require the county commissioners to call for a meeting of the E9-1-1 Planning Committee. Any adjustments made to the plan by the E9-1-1 Planning Committee are made under the advice of the Technical Advisory Committee.

Upon the conclusion of discussing the topic, Mr. Wippel offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Reeser authorizing the Pickaway County E9-1-1 Planning Committee to convene and request the Technical Advisory Committee to meet and explore the matter and make a recommendation to the Planning Committee.
